Flames Prep hockey season in review

The SMA Prep team had a great 13-14 season with consistent improvement, culminating in a standing of 28 wins, 12 losses, 5 ties and 2 shutout losses for a 60% overall wins record.

The team travelled to several tournaments. The first was in Stoney Creek, ON in Sept 2013, with a final placing of 2nd out of 64 teams from across North America. A highlight of the trip was a visit to the childhood home of the Great One, where Walter Gretzky entertained the team and coaching staff for over an hour!

The next tournament was in October in Morden, MB for the 2nd annual Thanksgiving Classic, where the Flames continued on an amazing run, scoring 17 goals and only

giving up 6 in 4 games to go undefeated in capturing the Classic Championship. The third tournament was the Two Nations College Prep Series in Detroit, Michigan. A disappointing semi-final 5-4 loss in overtime did not erase fond memories of excellent hockey, and a team outing to Joe Louis Arena to watch the Detroit Red Wings take on the New York Rangers.

Early December took the team to the Mandi Schwartz Classic in Wilcox, SK for the third straight year. A strong win, a close loss and a tie put the team on the difficult side of trying to get into the Championship. A semi-final nail-biter went to a shootout and a 3-2 loss sent us to the B side finals, where our gals literally put a stamp on their feelings with what would be the most lopsided victory of our entire season, a 9-0 shellacking of long-time rival and equally strong opponent, the Westman Wildcats.

In January the team went to Thunder Bay,

ON for the 3rd annual home-and-away series of three games against the Queens squad. The Flames came out with two strong wins and a third game 3-0 loss.

The season, sprinkled in with several exhibition games each month, ended on a high note with a very impressive 3rd place showing in our own 2nd Annual Female World Sport School Challenge in mid-March.

As we say goodbye to eight players (five graduating) we celebrate all five seniors who found a meaningful and competitive place to play university/college hockey next year, and that our grade 11s are all receiving offers and committing to major Division One schools for the 2015 season.

God has been good to us in granting us safe travel, relatively speedy recoveries from injuries and health scares, and we all can look back on a year of new friendships and great memories.

We had the privilege of visiting the Marie-

Rose Centre in Longueuil where the Holy Names Sisters graciously toured us around the Congregational House, the chapel and the Cathedral where we visited the tomb of Blessed Mother Marie-Rose. We were also blessed to attend mass at the Ste-Annede–Beaupré Basilica, a world-renowned pilgrimage site. We visited the tomb of St. André at Saint Joseph's Oratory in Montréal and went through the Sacred Door at Notre-Dame in Québec city.

We admired four centuries of history in Canada's oldest neighbourhood, Place

Royale in Québec city. We took a ferry ride across the St. Lawrence River and we also visited the Montmorency Falls. We were impressed by the Ice Hotel, a work of art made entirely of ice and snow. The Biodome was an interesting walk through four ecological zones, including a tropical rainforest and the Arctic Desert.
