School Calendar

A calendar of major events is available on the SMA website. The calendar outlines important dates including **two major** assessment periods in December/January and June. All students are expected to be present during the assessment periods. A doctor's certificate is required to verify illness or absence during the assessment periods. Parents are asked *NOT* to book holidays or time away from school during these periods. If a student misses a mid-year assessment it will affect the value of their final mark.

School-wide Retreat/Rally (Retrally), Reflection Days and Liturgies

These are important, mandatory community-building events for all students. Kindly become familiar with the school calendar and do not make any appointments on these dates.

Student Timetables, Student Agendas, Lockers and Locks

These will be distributed during the first homeroom period on Thursday, September 10, 2015. The agenda includes the school calendar, general school information, policies and procedures, and student information.

Textbooks

On the first day of classes, subject teachers issue numbered textbooks to each student. Each assigned textbook is the responsibility of the student to whom it is assigned. In June 2016, students are responsible for returning assigned textbooks in accordance

with the following procedures:

Non-exam courses: to the subject teacher at the last class.

Exam courses: prior to the final exam in a designated classroom.

Students who do not return textbooks as indicated or who have damaged or lost textbooks must pay the replacement cost and a \$25.00 fine by June 25, 2016.

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Project El Salvador

Project El Salvador 2015 was a great success! It was a privilege to witness and serve with the community of Huisisilapa, El Salvador this past summer. On June 30, 2015 the SMA team of 18 students and 3 staff members departed for an experience of a lifetime. Upon arriving in San Salvador, the group was welcomed with open arms at Casa Oasis. The staff went above and beyond to make our accommodations feel like a home away from home. The next day we were greeted by Roberto (our translator) and boarded the bus to our new community, Huisisilapa. This community is built upon the resilience and perseverance of its members. After facing exile in Guatemala for nearly a decade, many families were determined to return to El Salvador. Eventually they were able to purchase the land of Huisisilapa and rebuild their community.

Our group of students and staff quickly bonded with the people in the community. It was remarkable to see the smiling faces of the children and the dedication and spirit of the entire village. Over the course of two weeks, our SMA students worked on a variety of projects. The team saw the completion of a sidewalk around the community building, sanding and repainting of all window guards, construction of a small room to be used for the radio station, painting of all the walls and a new roof. The girls were also able to present a scholarship in the amount of \$800 to local girls attending school. Over and above the many changes we saw, the team created friendships with the people of the community that will be deeply treasured.

Our time in El Salvador was also filled with moments of education and team bonding. The group was honored to witness Roberto's stories throughout our experience. We learned the history of the civil war in El Salvador and saw the consequences of the years of tragedy and oppression. During our nightly reflections, many girls noted the importance of gratitude and social justice. Though we returned to Canada on July 14, the effects of our experience are far reaching.

We are deeply grateful to the community for welcoming us into their lives. The team would also like to extend our gratitude to the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary, Mrs. Yunyk for joining us on our journey and all those who contributed to this amazing and life giving project. Overall, Project El Salvador 2015 was an incredible experience that touched the lives of all who were involved.



SNJM Youth Justice Forum

This July I was fortunate to accompany three students (grades 9 and 11) to the third SNJM Youth Justice Forum in Montreal. The forum is held every three years and is a gathering of students from the SNJM schools around the world (Portland, Seattle, Albany, Tampa Bay, Oakland, Alhambra, Lesotho and Winnipeg).

Preparation for the five day event began long before our departure to Montreal. Each school group was responsible for preparing several activities throughout the week, including a morning and evening prayer, presenting an example of a social justice activity from their school and a cultural activity showing each schools' home community.

The forum officially began on Thursday, July 16 with ice breaker activities and each of the next three days was dedicated to learning about and understanding issues which are important to the SNJM: **immigration and refugees, human trafficking and water issues.** Students from the various schools

presented on each topic, educating the other girls as well as invited guests about each issue. Morning and evening prayer concentrated on the same theme, dedicating the day to the issue at hand. These presentations were broken up by various service learning opportunities throughout the community. Additionally, the group toured the congregation and foundation houses of the SNJM sisters. We also had an opportunity to celebrate mass with the sisters.

The last day of the conference allowed time for students from each school to gather,

digest the information from the week and come up with ways to share the knowledge with their own school communities. Our SMA students are hoping to concentrate their efforts on advancing the education of girls in developing countries. We feel strongly that educating girls in developing countries can help local communities in a way that addresses all three aspects of the SNJM corporate stand.

Overall, the conference was a huge success with students and teacher leaders leaving inspired, passionate and educated about key issues important to the SNJM.
