Project El Salvador

On June 27 a group of 17 students, Ms. Maria Martino and myself left for our mission trip to El Salvador. We were joined later in the week by Mrs. Yunyk and our graduating student Selina Audio '17.

For the third year we returned to the community of Huisisilapa to a very warm welcome. There was a ceremony in which the students from the community performed traditional dances and music. They have been working very hard to expand teaching and learning in the arts.

Our project was to start construction of a perimeter wall around the school property, in addition to adding a safety railing to the school yard area. The wall gives students greater safety and security from both the elements and any other threats, such as wild animals. It also provides greater security for the school and its equipment. This is the first part of the wall that will be a multiyear project due to its vast size and cost. For several days we worked at preparing the site. We had to dig down 1.5 meters for the foundation of the wall, which was a challenge with all the roots and large stones. There was a lot of excitement and relief when we finally stopped digging down and started to build up. SMA students worked with rebar, mixing cement with shovels, setting cinder blocks, and adding the cement to the wall. The mason said he would hire any of them!

Each day we would take time to interact with members of the community in some way other than just work. We visited several classrooms and shared with each other some of the details of our lives. We also played games with the children. We brought floor hockey equipment for the school and after teaching them the basics the children were hooked and asked to play every day.

On our off days we went to Mass at the

Cathedral, visited Bishop Romero's home, toured the national memorial at Cuscatlan Park, the central University and the volcano park. We also spent the day hiking at El Rey National Park Preserve where there are several guerilla encampments. Hearing the history of the country and its people was especially moving for our students.

Each evening after a delicious meal we would come together and reflect on the day. Students commented on a wide variety of topics and how these experiences were changing their perspective on things in their own life. While there were times that some of the things that were viewed may have been upsetting, it served a purpose in helping students to grow.

Many thanks to the staff, administration, SNJM, families and everyone in our community who supported the project. The experience that the students receive on this trip is one that can not be replicated in the classroom, and it would not be possible without your support.
