## 3rd Annual Female World Sport School Challenge

St. Mary's Academy is pleased to host the 3rd annual Female World Sport School Challenge (FWSSC) taking place at the MTS Iceplex from March 12-15, 2015.

The FWSSC is in its 3rd consecutive year however, this is the first year that SMA has sole ownership of this Hockey Canada initiated event.

This year's eight-team tournament brings together Canadian female hockey teams from seven Sport Schools along with one AAA Regional team. Sport School teams participating include two Winnipeg schools: St. Mary's Academy and Shaftesbury Hockey Academy. They are joined by the Banff Hockey Academy from Banff, AB, St. Francis Xavier High School from Edmonton, AB, Warner Hockey School from Warner, AB and two teams from Pursuit of Excellence Hockey Academy in Kelowna, BC. The Thunder Bay Queens are the AAA Regional team joining the challenge this year.

Individual game tickets are \$5 each (children 12 and under are free). Tournament Passes are \$25 each. Available at the door.

### Volunteer for the Tournament


SMA is looking for adult volunteers to fill various positions during the tournament weekend.

# Online Safety

### Online Safety - A Valuable Lesson

"Would I send this video or picture to my own family?" If the answer is no, then DON'T SEND IT!

This was one of the important messages Constable Sandra Murner related to grades 7, 8, 9 and 10 girls during **Online Safety** presentations held at SMA on November 12th and January 22nd.

Constable Murner is a member of the Winnipeg Police Service School Education Unit and discusses online safety with students in 52 schools across Winnipeg. She is well informed about this topic and provided valuable information to SMA girls.

Constable Murner began her presentation by dispelling three myths that apply to social media:

Myth #1: Everything online is temporary. According to Constable Murner this is false. Online information can be very hard to remove. Even if you delete a post, someone may have already made copies and distrib-

uted the information. It is out there forever.

Myth #2: Online profiles can be completely private. Not so said Constable Murner. Your personal information can be

passed on by anyone who has been allowed access into your site.

Myth #3: Posting a risqué photo is fine as long as it really is you and not someone else. Constable Murner warned that any picture uploaded on the web can be downloaded by anyone and be copied or posted online forever! This can result in a permanent digital footprint.

### Cyber bullying

Constable Murner discussed how online interactions can lead to cyber bullying or exploitation. She revealed that at least 42% of all students have experienced cyber bullying. This can lead to emotional damage, criminal charges and/ or civil law suits. It is important to report cyber bullying immediately to a trusted adult.

Constable Murner also informed students about the tactics that cyber predators use to entice innocent victims. They begin online friendships, asking many personal questions and gaining a victim's trust. Interactions may lead to sexual talks and an offer of money or gifts for sexual acts. Predators may try to meet victims, offering to pay for airline tickets to visit.

Constable Murner stressed that cyber predators pretend to be people they are not and lurk in online chatting, gaming and social networking sites. Her advice was to only allow people you know in real life to be your friend online.

#### Sexting

Constable Murner raised the issue of sexting, which is sending sexually explicit messages or photos electronically, primarily between cell phones. She stated that if you send such photos and you are under the age of 18, you are distributing child pornography. Her message was clear. You can be arrested for sexting!

Constable Murner ended her presentation with wise advice: Be responsible and think about your choices when going online.

### Gr. 12 Post-Secondary Planning

Grade 12 students are reminded to check the SMA Career Information website for regular updates on admission and scholarships presentations.

Students who are applying out of province are also reminded to email Ms. Uruski asap with the information of where their official school transcript needs to be sent, along with their assigned student number for that post secondary institution.

### Gr. 11 Post-Secondary Information Sessions

Grade 11 students attended the **University** of Manitoba Info. Days on Feb 19th. This event offered students the opportunity to get a tour of the U of M Campus and to find out more about the programs offered at the university. The students also received information about the advantages of be-

coming an affiliate of **St. Paul's College** at the University of Manitoba.

Representatives from both the **U** of **M** and **U** of **W** met with students on Feb 5th and 6th to review program and faculty options, including the review of high school course requirements.

**University of Winnipeg** Open House was on Feb 18th. The event provided students the ability to ask questions and obtain detailed information from both professors and current students.

**Red River College Open House** was on Feb 17th at all three of their campuses.

### Gr. 10 Career Development Classes

All Grade 10 students started their Career Development Classes in February. They will also have an opportunity with their parents to meet with representatives from the Universities of Manitoba and Winnipeg and Red River College as part of SMA's annual Post Secondary Information Evening at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, Feb 25th.

Students will be attending the Rotary Career Symposium on April 21st where they will spend the day learning about a variety of career and additional post-secondary educational opportunities. This activity is mandatory for all Gr. 10 students. Further information along with the permission form will be provided to your daughter in March.




