# President's



Last time our newsletter hit your inbox, I wished you a Merry Christmaswe are now in full 2017 mode! Happy New Year! It has been an extremely active January and February already and lots to

look forward to in the months ahead! This month's newsletter describes the "happenings" around the Academy and throughout our school community; here are a few highlights from my vantage point.

If you have not yet had a chance to read our 5-year Strategic Plan, Leading, Learning and Legacy, I strongly recommend setting aside an hour to get informed about our roadmap for the next five years— a roadmap which has our students and the sustainability of our operation at the core

We are very encouraged by the number of young women and parents who came to our Open House on January 31. Moreover, we have had very strong numbers for students applying for our Grades 7 to 11 program. The admission process is also in full swing, with two test dates and new student interviews taking place over the next month. As well, re-registration of current students will be sent via email immediately following the SMA School Board meeting on March 13, where tuition for the upcoming school year will be set. **Deadline for re-registration is Tuesday March 21.** Please make sure your package is returned to the President's Office! Bursary applications are due

May 1, 2017; SMA strives to remain accessible to all qualified families who wish to have their daughters experience an SMA education. We have a healthy Bursary Fund overseen by a committed Foundation Board who is charged with ensuring our Fund

continues to grow over the next five years and beyond. In the current school year, 78 students were awarded bursaries totaling \$325,900 — representing 13.7% of our student population.

Finally, I am both proud and delighted to inform you that the Class of 1965 and Commercial Class of 1965 have been selected as this year's Marian Awards of Excellence recipients. The Class of 1965 epitomizes what it means to Hold High the Torch for their generous and continued service and engagement demonstrated to the St. Mary's Academy community.
