Gold medals were awarded to Stephanie Knysh & Kate George for their project, The Effects of Physical Activity on the Female Brain. *Grade 12:* Sandy Lee has been working on aspects of cancer research with her mentor for several years as part of the Sanofi BioGENEius Challenge program. Sandy's

## Art Auction supports SMA's Bursary Fund and the Art Department Special Fund

This year SMA's annual live Art Auction was a resounding success with a record \$2,246 raised!

The Auction was held in Durocher Library over the lunch hour during the week of May 6. Hundreds of students and staff enthusiastically bid on over one hundred pieces of student and teacher art.

This year's enthusiastic grade twelve art students created a number of original canvasses just for the auction, contributing to its great success! The Auction also benefitted from a small core of grade 12 students who helped get the work to the library, display work, keep records of sales etc.

## The Beginnings

The Art Auction started in the late 1980s to increase awareness among the students of the wonderful work of SMA's Bursary Fund. Every year, the proceeds from the Art Auction are split between the Bursary Fund and the Art Department—Special Fund.

Over the first number of years, the students donated small drawings from their sketchbooks and the items would sell from 10 cents to a few dollars.

In 2003, the Auction hit a record high amount when Katie Cibinel ('01) donated a number of her St. Mary's Academy cartoon characters. These items were incredibly popular and a record amount of approximately \$880 was raised.

The next major growth came in the Spring of 2009. The previous May ('08), the grade eleven art class asked "What was the record amount raised." One student - Melissa Coyle ('09) - promptly said "We'll break \$1,000."

Sure enough, the next spring, the Auction swept past the \$1,000 with the great support of the senior art students.
