The Junior Track and Field Team had a great day competing against a number of the top schools at the Junior High Provincial Championships.

Results for grade 7: Alyssa Moon 4th in 800m and 6th in 1200m, Jean Thomson 2nd in High Jump, Grade 7 medley team finished 2nd (team consisted of Alyssa Moon, Jean Thomson, Gabi Dawyduk, and Rorie Ringer).

Results for Grade 8: Maya Blatt 2nd and Meagan Gillis 6th in the 100m, Amanda Dillon 5th in the 800m (finishing with a personal best) and Victoria Bird 3rd in High Jump. The grade 8s had two medley relay teams finishing 3rd and 4th (teams consisted of Sarah Dennehy, Amanda Dillon, Maya Blatt and Meagan Gillis, Jade Blando, Emily Warner, Cirena Maurice and Chloe Krietz), Tristan Chambers finished with two firsts in the 300m and 800m, **Claire Healey** finished with two seconds in the 800m and 1200m. They were both a part of the provincial championship medley relay team that consisted of two grade 8s, **Gretta Styles** and **McKenna Baron**.

MHSAA Provincial Championships Results: Sierra Sutherland broke the 5

minute barrier (4:57) in the 1500m and was rewarded with a bronze medal. Sierra also finished 2nd in the 800m and ran a personal best in the preliminary heats at 2:23, qualifying her for the national championships. **Belinda Guerra** 5th in the 1500m (5:00) and 3000m and ran a 2:22 in the 800m in pouring rain completing her last high school career with a bronze medal performance. **Megan Wrublowsky** hurdled herself to a bronze medal and also finishing 4th in the 400m. **Brianna Patrick** held her own in the javelin and came out with bronze medal and **Taylor Boughton** came 7th in her Javelin competition. We had **Claire Healey** 7th in 3000m and **Sam Cattani** 7th in Tetrathalon missing the podium by 36 points. **Amanda Ludlow** had a great run in the 400m finishing 4th. The team of **Sierra Sutherland**, **Amanda Ludlow**, **Samantha Filuk Enns and Tristan Chambers** captured the silver medal in the medley relay and so did the team of **Belinda Guerra**, **Megan Wrublowsky**, **Aisha Hussein and Samantha Cattani** in a very close finish in the varsity medley relay.

To cap off the brilliant gold medal effort by all our athletes, the Junior varsity 4x400 relay team of **Sierra Sutherland, Tristan Chambers, Ainsley Cameron, Amanda Ludlow and alternate Claire Healey** are the 2015 provincial champions in that event.

In closing thank you to all the parents with their gold medal performance in finding a way of getting your daughter(s) to all those early morning practices and competitions.
