An Evening at the Academy In support of SMA's Bursary Fund

Fundamental to the mission of the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary (SNJM) is the ethos of serving the impoverished and marginalized. At SMA, one of the ways this value is accomplished is through the Bursary Fund—this Fund provides tuition assistance to deserving students. For the current school year, 85 bursaries totaling over \$375,000 were awarded. It is incumbent upon SMA to have a Bursary Fund that meets the needs of families, and one of the way in which this is achieved is by hosting, *An Evening at the Academy*, with net proceeds going directly to the Bursary Fund.

On January 26, 2019 the 4th annual, *An Evening at the Academy*, takes place.

This unique event is a progressive dining experience that takes guests through time and space within St. Mary's Academy's historic

walls. The experience begins with cocktails and appetizers in the historic 1902 building, followed by dinner in the 1963 cafeteria (which is transformed into a fashionable dining hall), and the evening is capped off with drinks, mingling and live music in the 2013 Sheila Chipman Atrium.

As the leaves change colour we find ourselves preparing for winter. Pulling out our coats, finding matching mittens and dusting off boots are all practiced ways to get ready for winter. But how do you prepare to celebrate a legacy of 150 years? This September we set out a challenge for staff and students to learn about SMA's roots and rich history.

Students at the Grade 12 Day of Reflection spent the day reflecting on 'Our Story of SMA', and were asked to examine what their chapter in the story looks like, and how do they connect to the hundreds of young women who went before them. At the Grade 9 Welcome Night, students were given a glimpse of how the SMA story unfolded, and were challenged with a mission to be the best version of themselves. At the **Grade** 7 **Camp**, students shared in games and activities, and looked at what they need to begin their journey through SMA. They were then challenged to join a club, a team or activity that would help them become a part of our community, and enable them to share their gifts and talents.

On October 6 we celebrated the Feast Day of Mother Marie-Rose (MMR). MMR, as we lovingly refer to her, was the foundress of the Sisters of the Holy Names of Jesus and Mary in October of 1843. It is through her vision and desire to educate the poor and empower women spiritually and intellectually that SMA is the school it is today. We spent a wonderful week highlighting MMR in many ways. Students went on

scavenger hunts around the school to find roses with clues to answer for spirit points. Lunch time activities included MMR trivia and a drawing contest, where Mother Marie Rose joined us and sat for her portrait. Our week long celebration was brought to a close with Mass and a small reception where three members from each homeroom had time to visit and celebrate with one of the SNIM sisters, and students taught them how to play our specially designed Kahoot. A highlight for the Sisters!

To encourage ongoing learning and to help us be ready for 150th celebrations, each class has been given the task of finding a small piece of SMA history of which they will share during their class Wednesday Morning Prayer.

Events and Activities

Wednesday Morning Prayer began on October 17 and takes place every Wednesday at 8:00 a.m. in Holy Names Chapel until the May long weekend. Each week a different homeroom leads the ministries, as we celebrate together with Eucharist or Morning Prayer. Wednesday morning prayer is a long standing tradition that began when the SNJMs were living at SMA. Parents and families are always welcome! Holy Names Chapel is located on the 2nd floor of the Administration Building.

Service Fair: The Service Learning Fair took place on October 16. This Fair gave students a chance to talk to representatives from

various organizations, and learn about the many service-learning opportunities available to them. We were fortunate to have 10 organizations at the Fair.

Harvest Thursday: From Thursday, October 18, and for each Thursday until May long weekend, a small group of students accompanied by a teacher, serves for about an hour at the Unitarian Universalist Church (a Winnipeg Harvest satellite distribution location).

Justice Walking (J-Walking): Aimed at our Grade 11 classes, will help at the Welcome Home one Thursday evening a month from November to May.

Junior Club L.E.M.O.N (Leaders Embarking on a Mission Over Noon/ Nourishment): This is a branch of Campus Ministry for junior students, led by a Grade 10 student team. Junior Club Lemon is a great place to meet new people, help others, build a sense of community and share faith over lunch.

AMS@SMA (A Monthly Service): Will start at the end of October. Together we help at various locations around the city including, Villa Rosa, Ronald McDonald House and The Angel Squad for Misericordia Health Center.
